

St. Olaf tour

Excursion to St. Olaf College, Northfield, MN: Thursday, May 11, 1:00 PM - 5:00 PM. Bus departs from and returns to Hyatt Regency Hotel. Cost is \$25 (includes roundtrip transportation), payable when registering.

Located about 45 minutes from downtown Minneapolis, St. Olaf is the home of Rolvaag Memorial Library, with its college archives, the Norwegian-American Historical Association archives, the Kierkegaard Library, and the St. Olaf Special Collections.

Participants will have guided tours of all four, and will also have time for independent exploration of both the collections and the college.

The heart of the NAHA archives is its extensive manuscript collection, which includes letters, diaries, journals and ledgers, newspaper clippings, obituaries, congregational records, family and local histories, and other resources related to Norwegians in America. The archival collection also includes photographs illustrating all aspects of Norwegian-American history.
